Description:

Program to serve 100 youth ages 14-24 (including 40 in school and 60 out of school youth). Work readiness, career development hands on work experience financial literacy, certificate attainment and portfolio development are included. The first week of the program is work readiness to prepare for entry into the work force followed by 5 weeks of work experience at a local business or public facility. 1 day each week youth will continue to participate in classroom activities that include work readiness, financial literacy. Youth will earn an OSHA10 certificate.

Description:

Program to serve 50 in school youth ages 14-15 for 6 weeks. The goal is to provide youth a positive introduction into the world of work. Included are classroom work readiness and work experience site placement activities based upon their interest and needs. The first week of the program consists of 20 hours of work readiness and career exploration to help students identify areas of interest. During the 5 remaining weeks students have 2½ hours of classroom work on Monday and Friday and 15 hours of work site placement on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Certificate awarded will be Work Readiness.

Description:

Program to serve 21 youth ages 14-24 in two tracks:

1) Ocean Sustainability Program: serves youth 16-24 in the Ocean Sustainability summer work and learn program that incorporates work experience, career exploration, leadership development, adult mentoring, basic skills development and job readiness. Focus is on hands-on activities that include coordinating a press conference; a social media marketing campaign and a shoreline clean up with Clean the Bay. A certificate of completion from Constant Contract for their Social Media Boot Camp, a certificate of completion from CCRI for marketing training, and a credential from the RI Hospitality First Impressions Customer Service Training will be earned.

2) International Yacht Restoration School: a 6 week program serves in school younger youth in partnership with IYRS in the Marine Trades Summer Work and Learn Program. Components are work experience, career exploration, leadership development, adult mentoring, basic skills development and job readiness. Hands-on activities such as woodworking, tool handling, and painting as well as field trips are planned. A certificate of completion from IYRS and a credential from RI Hospitality Association for the First Impressions: Exceptional Customer Service will be earned.

Description:

A 6 week program to serve 20 youth (10 in school and 10 out of school) ages 14-24 at the McColl Field YMCA. There will be 4 days of work activity and 1 day of classroom time for a total of 20 hours per week. Included in classroom time is a work readiness component including financial literacy, leadership development and workers safety. Younger youth ages 14-17 will work as camp counselors and art teachers. They will earn a caregiver and babysitter certification. Older youth will work on nature trails, building and operations, etc and will earn a CPR and First Aid Certification.

During the remaining 5 weeks, there will be 1 day per week devoted to work readiness activities. Work site examples are in health care, manufacturing, bioscience, communications, agriculture, etc. Running a snack bar at FRCA is a scheduled entrepreneurial program.

Work experience involves one of the following: planning a non-violence block party, community gardening/landscaping, aqua-ponic food production, working at local non-profits and city departments, or working on staff at the Woodlawn CDC. 3 older youth will work as supervisors. The first week of the program will be work readiness workshops followed by 5 weeks at placement sites. The certificate awarded will be "Above the Influence" conferred by the Pawtucket Prevention Coalition.

The 6 week program serves 92 youth ages 14-24 in a collaborative among 6 B&G Clubs summer day camps. Some of the focus is on Hospitality & Tourism. For example, youth from Woonsocket will be placed in healthcare and youth in Newport will be placed at Camp Grosvenor. The collaborative will offer a joint 2 day (14 hour) job readiness training during the first week of the program. An additional 6 hours of work readiness training will take place over the remaining 5 weeks of the program. The program will offer certificates in SafeSitter, Jr. Lifeguarding and CPR.

Work experience sites will be the City of Woonsocket, Seven Hills RI (CNA and kitchen), as well as other sites to be determined. Work readiness activities are scheduled for 1 day per week with the remaining 4 days on the work site. Transportation barriers will be addressed through public transportation. Certificate awarded will be OSHA or Serve Safe.

A 6 week program to serve 22 youth ages 14-21 in the Earn While You Learn program. A 2 day work readiness workshop is followed by matching with a job coach for the remainder of the program. Leadership and work readiness is scheduled for 1 day per week with the remaining 4 days on the work site. Construction and green industries, computer, hospitality, engineering/manufacturing industries are targeted. Certificate awarded will be OSHA.
