



## Projected Revisions for Rhode Island June 2015 Job Estimates

DLT projections indicate that the June 2015 job count was 484,400 which is 1,500 more than the official published figure of 482,900. This revision increases the reported gain of 5,000 jobs for the June 2014 to June 2015 period to 6,500.

### *Summary of Revision Changes by Sector*

- An upward revision of 1,000 jobs is expected in the June 2015 private sector job estimate. It is expected that the Public sector job count will be revised up 500.
- In the private sector, job estimates for the Construction and Retail Trade sectors will have the largest upward revisions with the originally published estimates for these two sector being revised up by 1,800 and 1,700, respectively.
- Smaller upward revisions are projected for the Financial Services (+700) and Educational Services (+300) sectors.
- The largest downward revision of 800 jobs is projected for the Other Services sector, followed closely by the Health Care & Social Assistance and Accommodation & Food Services sectors as the job count is expected to be revised down by 700 jobs in each.
- Smaller downward revisions are expected in the Manufacturing (-400), Transportation & Utilities (-400) Professional & Business Services (-300) and Information (-200) sectors.
- The public sector employment level is expected to be revised up by 500 jobs due to a projected increase in the local government (+500) jobs estimate.

### *Revised Year over Year Change*

- These estimates derived from tax data show that over the year, Rhode Island gained 6,500 (+1.4%) jobs between June 2014 and June 2015. The BLS estimates released earlier this year for the same period showed a job gain of 5,000 (+1.0) jobs for that period.
- Private sector employment is up 6,800 (1.6%) over the year, while employment in the public sector is projected to decline by 300 (-0.5%).
- Within the private sector, nearly all sectors experienced job gains over the year, with the largest occurring in Professional Business Services (+3,000), Accommodation & Food Services (+1,100), Retail Trade (+1,100) and Financial Activities (+700).
- Information was the only private sector to experience a decline over the year with the number of jobs in the sector projected to fall by 400.
- Within the Public sector employment is projected to fall by 300 between June 2014 and June 2015, as a gain of 200 jobs in the federal segment is overshadowed by losses in the state and local segments of 300 and 200, respectively.
