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# Introduction

## State of the State – A Statistical Profile of Rhode Island’s Cities and Towns

From Burrillville to Block Island, from Woonsocket to Westerly, recent demographic and employment trends have impacted the lives of all Rhode Islanders. Incorporating information collected by the United States Department of Commerce and the Rhode Island Department of Labor and Training, **State of the State** depicts demographic changes and recent employment trends that have impacted our local economies over the last twenty years.

Population diversity based on age, sex, race, and ethnicity, as well as educational attainment, labor force statistics, and English language proficiency of local residents, is encapsulated in statistical profiles for each of Rhode Island’s thirty-nine communities. An overview of local private sector employment by industry sector is also provided on a city and town basis.

# Overview

Rhode Island reached peak private employment levels in 2006 with an average of 417,700 private sector jobs within the state. The annual average unemployment rate for the year was 4.9 percent and the state's population stood at 1,060,196.

Rhode Island's economic momentum began to change the following year, and the state entered into a recessionary period months earlier than the official National Recession. By 2009, the height of the recession in Rhode Island, the number of private jobs averaged 387,800, the annual average unemployment rate was 11.0 percent, and the state's population had shrank to 1,053,209 residents.

Since the end of the recession, Rhode Island has been gradually recovering. As of 2015, private job levels averaged 411,036, an increase of 23,212 (+6.0%) from the 2009 average and the unemployment rate is down 5.0 percentage points to 6.0 percent. The state's population has yet to regain residents lost during the recession, as the count stood at 1,056,298 in 2015, down 3,898 (-0.4%) from 2006. On a positive note, the population in 2015 increased over 2014 by 1,391 (+0.1%)

residents, the fourth consecutive over-the-year increase in population.

## Other Findings

- ◆ Twenty-three of the state's thirty-nine cities and towns reported total employment growth between 2014-2015, with Little Compton having the largest over-the-year increase (+7.0%). Barrington (-9.9%) posted the largest total employment decrease.
- ◆ Providence establishments employed the largest percentage (23.6%) of Rhode Island private sector workers, followed by Warwick (10.6%), Cranston (7.3%), Pawtucket (5.1%) and East Providence (4.7%).
- ◆ Rhode Island total annual average employment in 2015 (470,019) was the highest employment level since 2007 (480,232).
- ◆ The state experienced a 0.1 percent population increase between the 2014 and 2015 population estimate. Twenty-eight cities and towns gained residents, with Cumberland (+219), Lincoln (+158) and Woonsocket (+146) adding the most people. Of the eleven towns that lost residents, only Warwick (-176) lost more than 100 residents.
- ◆ Rhode Island (6.0%) was tied for the 11<sup>th</sup> highest annual average unemployment rate in the country in 2015. The District of Columbia (6.9%), Nevada (6.7%) and West Virginia (6.7%) had the highest rates in the country. The annual average unemployment rate for the United States as a whole in 2015 was 5.3 percent.



- ◆ Rhode Island's total population increased by 4.5 percent during the 1990's, with the gain of 44,855 people, while between 2000 and 2014, Rhode Island gained 4,933 (+0.5%) residents.
- ◆ Nearly 40 percent (39.7%) of Rhode Island residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2014. The share of state residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2000 and 2014, falling from 22.0 percent to 14.6 percent.
- ◆ Between 2009 and 2015, employment in Rhode Island increased by 21,544 (+4.8%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 23,212 (+6.0%) jobs, while public sector employment fell by 1,669 (-2.8%) jobs.
- ◆ Rhode Island's unemployment rate averaged 6.0 percent in 2015, a decrease of 5.0 percentage points from the 2009 average of 11.0 percent.
- ◆ In 2010, 94.7 percent of Rhode Island residents age 18-64 spoke only English or spoke another language and English either well or very well.
- ◆ Over one-fifth (20.3%) of Rhode Island residents work in Providence, while 14.2 percent work outside of Rhode Island.


- ◆ The percentage of Rhode Islanders who spoke only English or spoke another language and English either well or very well declined from 95.5 percent in 2000 to 94.7 percent in 2010.
- ◆ The percentage of total residents aged 18 to 64 that spoke Spanish while speaking English either not well or not at all increased by 0.9 of a percentage point to 3.7 percent in 2010, representing 33.6 percent of all Spanish-speaking Rhode Islanders.

- ◆ The Health Care & Social Assistance (19.9%) industry sector employs the largest percentage of private Rhode Island workers, followed by Retail Trade (11.7%) and Accommodation & Food Services (11.5%).
- ◆ Providence (95,876) had the largest number of private sector workers in the state, followed by Warwick (43,125) and Cranston (28,981). Foster (386) and Little Compton (517) had the fewest number of workers.



- ♦ Barrington's total population grew by 6.1 percent during the 1990's, with the addition of 970 people, however, between 2000 and 2014, Barrington lost 529 (-3.1%) residents.
- ♦ Over 73 percent of Barrington residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2014. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2000 and 2014, falling from 7.7 percent to 3.2 percent.
- ♦ Between 2009 and 2015, total employment in Barrington shrank by 13 (-0.4%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 54 (+2.4%) jobs, while public sector employment decreased by 67 (-9.3%) jobs. In comparison, statewide total employment grew by 21,544 (+4.8%) jobs.
- ♦ Barrington's unemployment rate averaged 4.1 percent in 2015, tied for the second lowest in the state and well below the state average of 6.0 percent.
- ♦ In 2010, 99.5 percent of Barrington residents age 18-64 spoke only English or spoke another language and English either well or very well, compared to 94.7 percent of RI residents.
- ♦ One-fifth (20.5%) of Barrington residents work in Barrington, while 15.2 percent work outside of RI.



- ◆ Bristol's total population grew by 3.9 percent during the 1990's, with the addition of 844 people. Between 2000 and 2014, Bristol added 24 (+0.1%) residents.
- ◆ Over two-fifths (43.1%) of Bristol residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2014. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2000 and 2014, falling from 25.9 percent to 13.0 percent.
- ◆ Between 2009 and 2015, employment in Bristol declined by 336 (-4.5%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a loss of 322 (-5.1%) jobs, while public sector employment dropped by 13 (-1.1%) jobs. In comparison, statewide total employment grew by 21,544 (+4.8%) jobs.
- ◆ Bristol's unemployment rate averaged 5.4 percent in 2015, tied for 16th lowest in the state and below the state average of 6.0 percent.
- ◆ In 2010, 98.8 percent of Bristol residents age 18-64 spoke only English or spoke another language and English either well or very well, compared to 94.7 percent of RI residents.
- ◆ Over a third (34.2%) of Bristol residents work in Bristol, while 12.7 percent work outside of RI.



- ◆ Burrillville's total population decreased by 2.7 percent during the 1990's, with the loss of 434 people, however, between 2000 and 2014, Burrillville gained 312 (+2.0%) residents.
- ◆ Over 29 percent of Burrillville residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2014. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2000 and 2014, falling from 19.6 percent to 12.6 percent.
- ◆ Between 2009 and 2015, employment in Burrillville increased by 253 (+8.9%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 276 (+12.5%) jobs, while public sector employment declined by 23 (-3.7%) jobs. In comparison, statewide total employment grew by 21,544 (+4.8%) jobs.
- ◆ Burrillville's unemployment rate averaged 6.0 percent in 2015, tied for the 12th highest in RI and equal to the state average of 6.0 percent.
- ◆ In 2010, 99.7 percent of Burrillville residents age 18-64 spoke only English or spoke another language and English either well or very well, compared to 94.7 percent of RI residents.



## Where Foster Residents Work, 2010





## Where Tiverton Residents Work, 2010





- ◆ Westerly's total population grew by 6.3 percent during the 1990's, with the addition of 1,361 people, however, between 2000 and 2014, Westerly lost 239 (-1.0%) residents.
- ◆ Nearly 43 percent of Westerly residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2014. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2000 and 2014, falling from 18.3 percent to 11.6 percent.
- ◆ Between 2009 and 2015, employment in Westerly increased by 232 (+2.5%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 217 (+2.6%) jobs, while public sector employment grew by 14 (+1.3%) jobs. In comparison, statewide total employment grew by 21,544 (+4.8%) jobs.
- ◆ Westerly's unemployment rate averaged 7.4 percent in 2015, the 4th highest in the state and above the state average of 6.0 percent.
- ◆ In 2010, 98.2 percent of Westerly residents age 18-64 spoke only English or spoke another language and English either well or very well, compared to 94.7 percent of RI residents.
- ◆ Nearly forty-five percent (44.9%) of Westerly residents work in Westerly, while 34.1 percent work outside of RI.



- Woonsocket's unemployment rate averaged 7.8 percent in 2015, the 2nd highest in the state and well above the state average of 6.0 percent.
- In 2010, 95.9 percent of Woonsocket residents age 18-64 spoke only English or spoke another language and English either well or very well, compared to 94.7 percent of RI residents.
- Nearly one-third (31.6%) of Woonsocket residents work in Woonsocket, while 30.0 percent work outside of RI.
