Organization	Requirements	Type Of Program/Employment
Central RI Area Health Education Center	Ages 14 to 15 Providence or Cranston	Summer. Training and Placement in health care facilities such as hospitals, community health centers, and elderly care and office settings. Minimum 15 hours per week
Goodwill Industries	Ages 14 to 15 Providence or Cranston	Summer. Transitional summer work program at Goodwill Industries locations. Monday through Thursdays from 9AM to 2PM. Activities include team building, job shadowing, and exposure to apprenticeship programs.
Volunteers in Providence Schools	Ages 14 to 15 Providence	Summer. A six week, four days per week summer employments program. Employment will focus on urban renewal – construction, architecture, design, financing, politics, and preservation.
RI Hospital/Lifespan PROGRAM FULL - CLOSED	Ages 16 to 19 Providence	Summer. Youth will be assigned to a variety of departments including: Lifespan Corporate Human Resources and Finance/Accounts Payable and in hospital departments such as transport, Medical Engineering, Cardiac Rehabilitation, Physical Therapy etc.
Mayor’s Substance Abuse Prevention Council	High School Students Providence	Summer. A five-week summer employment and job training program youth in still in high school. Youth will work with the Providence Police Department’s Police Activities League’s sports and recreation programs.
The Metropolitan Regional Career and Technical Center	Ages 14 to 15 Providence or Cranston	Summer. Work experiences exploring career pathways in construction, child development or engineering. Will include workplace mentors.
Mount Hope Neighborhood Association	Ages 18-21 Providence	Year-round. The program offers work preparation and maturity skills using the PBS Literacy link Workplace Essentials, The program focuses on employment, communication and writing, reading and math.
AS220 Broad Street Studio	Ages 16 to 21 Providence or Cranston	Year-round. Offers employment and training opportunities in the areas of arts, culture and tourism.
Institute for the Study and Practice of Nonviolence	Ages 14 to 19 Providence or Cranston	Summer. The 7-week summer program offers youth paid employment and leadership development in the form of training and practice in non-violent means of conflict resolution.
Year Up	High School Diploma or GED	Year-round. Provides a one year training and apprenticeship programs – the program includes 6 months of full time instruction and 6 months of apprenticeship.
Cranston Chamber of Commerce	Enrolled at the Charter School	Summer. The program offers students enrolled in the NE laborers’ Cranston Public School’s Construction Career Academy job training and summer employment
Mount Hope	Ages 14 to 15	Summer. The program operates May through August. It includes 2 weeks of

Providence Housing Authority	Ages 14 to 15 PHA Residents	Summer. The program offers a summer employment program for youth living in the 5 public housing family developments in Providence. Youth will serve as Junior Counselors in the Summer Youth Program.
Rhode Island Foster Parents Association	Ages 14 to 21 Providence or Cranston	Year-round. The program serves youth who are aging out of the foster care system 12-week comprehensive financial literacy training. Upon completion youth are provided an opportunity to open an Individual Development Account
Institute for Labor Studies and Research	14 to 24 Providence or Cranston	Year-round. The program offers youth instructional information on work preparation and maturity skills. Topics include: Child labor laws, Minimum Wage, Age Appropriate Working Hours, Workers Compensation, RI Employment Law and Health and Safety Regulations
The Cody Foundation – Exchange City	Ages 14 to 18 Providence or Cranston	Summer. The program offers a 2-week paid training program that focuses on classroom training and real world success. Youth will attend a weeklong job skills training followed by a 2-day experience in “Exchange City” – a real life town with 14 businesses. Youth will attend seminars and workshops focusing on hospitality, technology, business, culinary and leadership.

Gateway Healthcare/Valley School	Ages 14 to 18 Providence or Cranston Enrolled Gateway school	A yearlong program that begins in the summer, combining work readiness, work experiences, and academic skills.
Boys and Girls Clubs of Providence	Ages 14 to 18 Providence In-School	The summer program includes job training and paid employment. During the school year the program will focus on Career Prep: job development; Project Learn: education and Skill Tech: computer skills curriculum.
Comprehensive Community Action Program	Ages 16 to 18 Providence or Cranston Out of School	Offered at the Skills Center at the Providence Place Mall, this program assists young people in obtaining a GED if needed, academic skills development and preparation for work or continued education.
Comprehensive Community Action Program	Ages 19 to 21 Providence or Cranston	Offered at the Skills Center at the Providence Place Mall, this program assists young people in obtaining a GED if needed as well as Occupational Skills Training for employment.
